Poplar Bluff Regional Medical Center's application to relocate its new 250-bed, state-of-the-art hospital in the Eight Points development district was unanimously approved on September 12th by the Missouri Health Facilities Review Committee.

Marking one of the single largest corporate investments in Poplar Bluff's history, PBRMC will host groundbreaking celebrations on October 6th for the \$173 million hospital project. All hospital associates are invited to share in this momentous occasion at a special celebration outside the Support Services building from 2:30 p.m. through 7:30 p.m. Food, music and fun will fill the atmosphere to commemorate the groundbreaking of our new hospital.

"We are honored to serve Poplar Bluff and excited to expand our services to meet the region's growing healthcare needs," says Ann Barnhart, Division 2 President of Health Management Associates. "We take our responsibility to the community seriously. The decision to build our new medical campus at Eight Points will bring significant benefits to the Poplar Bluff community.

Relocating the new medical campus in the Eight Points development brings economic impact and infrastructure improvements to Poplar Bluff.

"This is a wonderful opportunity for Poplar Bluff," says Steve Halter, Greater Poplar Bluff Area Chamber of Commerce President. "Locating the new PBRMC in Eight Points is the best thing for Poplar Bluff. The entire community will greatly benefit from this project for years to come."

Top Performer on Key Quality Measures

We have been named one of The Joint Commission's Top Performers on Key Quality Measures!

This year, The Joint Commission began the Top Performers on Key Quality Measures ratings program as a means for highlighting for the public top-performing hospitals that have achieved excellence on a number of vital measures of quality of care for the public.

Our hospital is one of only 405 U.S. hospitals and critical access hospitals earning this distinction of top performer on key quality measures and for attaining and sustaining excellence in accountability measure performance.

Congratulations! This is a great tribute to the outstanding work and dedication of our physicians and associates.

ABOUT THE HONOR

The Joint Commission, which is the leading accreditor of health care organizations in America, recognized Poplar Bluff Regional Medical Center based on 2010 data reported about evidence-based clinical procedures that are shown to improve care for certain conditions, including heart attack, heart failure, pneumonia, surgical care and children's asthma.

To be recognized as a top performer on key quality measures, an organization must meet two 95 percent performance thresholds. First, it must achieve a composite performance of 95 percent or above after the results of all the accountability measures for which it reports data to The Joint Commission were factored into a single score, including measures that had less than 30 eligible cases or patients. Second, it must meet or exceed a 95 percent performance target for every single accountability measure for which it reports data, excluding any measures with less than 30 eligible cases or patients.

PBRMC was recognized for achieving these thresholds for heart attack, heart failure, pneumonia and children's asthma.

In addition to being included in a press release about The Joint Commission's "Improving America's Hospitals" annual report, our hospital will be recognized on The Joint Commission's Quality Check website (www.qualitycheck.org).



FLU VACCINE CLINICS

Healthcare Personnel Influenza Vaccination Program begins Oct. 3.

Flu shot clinics will be held at Poplar Bluff Regional Medical Center at various places and times, watch for announcements!

PBRMC is offering FREE flu vaccines to all healthcare personnel. It's convenient and easy to get your flu shot.

There will be Flu Shot Advocates in many departments throughout the facility and during all shifts. Check with your Director or Supervisor for information and watch for announcements detailing when and where flu shots will be available. Flu shots will be available in the Clinical Affairs office Monday through Friday during regular business hours beginning October 3, 2011. Flu Shot Advocates will be making rounds in the facility offering flu shots at various times.

You are always welcome to call the Employee Health Nurse for a private appointment to receive your flu shot at **727-2777**.

Flu Facts

Influenza is a serious disease! Each year about 200,000 people in the US are hospitalized and about 36,000 people die because of the flu.

Unvaccinated healthcare personnel (HCP) are a key vehicle for the transmission of influenza in health care settings because many HCP continue to work while in the asymptomatic stage of the disease. In other words, if you are not protected by the vaccine, you can contract the flu and be contagious before you even have the first symptom and spread the flu to your patients, co-workers, friends, and family.

The CDC strongly recommends that ALL healthcare personnel be vaccinated each year. Unfortunately data shows that three out of five HCPs do NOT accept the vaccination annually, putting themselves, their families, their co-workers, and their patients at risk by not being vaccinated.

Did you know?

YOU CANNOT GET THE FLU FROM A FLU SHOT!!!
The flu shot, an inactivated vaccine containing killed virus, is made from dead viruses and cannot give you the flu.

Side effects from the flu vaccine are very rare. The worst side effect you're likely to get from the flu shot is a sore arm. Serious adverse reactions are very rare. Local short-term reactions may include soreness at the injection site, slight fever, and an achy feeling, but they don't last long and can be alleviated with over-the-counter analgesics. These short-term effects are much less bothersome than catching the flu and being very ill for several days. You can be infected, not feel ill, and still transmit flu to at-risk patients. No one is immune from the flu virus. Studies show that most healthy adults can infect others with the flu up to 1 day before they start having symptoms and once sick, they can infect others for up to 5 days. Only about 50% of infected persons will develop the classical clinical symptoms of influenza.

Flu vaccines are highly effective in preventing the spread of the flu. Studies have shown that the inactivated flu shot is 70% to 90% effective in preventing the flu among healthy persons <65 years of age; 50% to 60% effective in preventing hospitalization; and 80% effective in preventing death.

So....as you can see, the flu vaccine is highly effective, has minimal side effects, provides protection not only for you but also your loved ones, co-workers, and patients, and is FREE! Why wouldn't you take it?

Servant Leader – Imran Cheema, M.D.

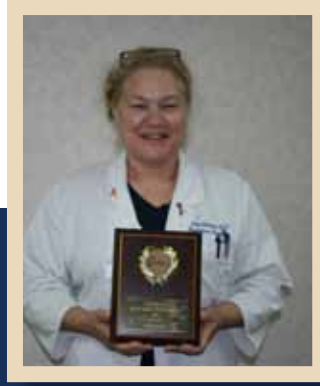

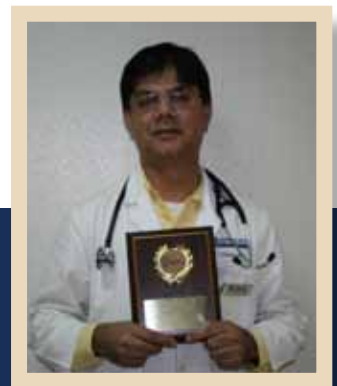

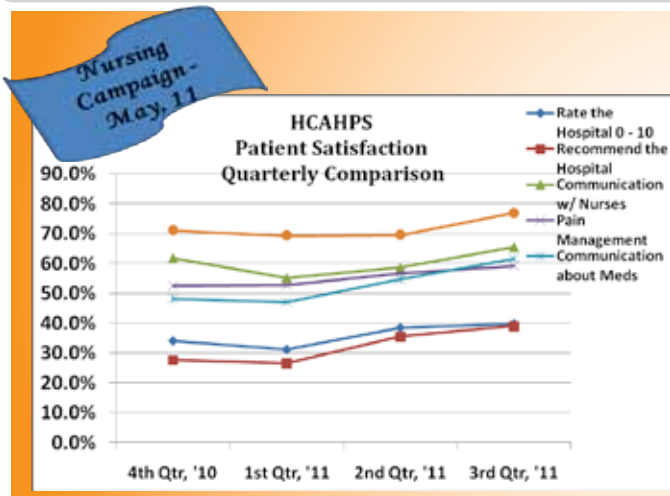
